

1. Ever wonder how some ice cream flavors or treats came about? Given a description of the origins of a type of ice cream or ice cream treats, name it for 10 points each.
 - (a) In addition to describing the ice cream's texture, this flavor, allegedly invented in 1929 by William Dreyer, accurately depicts the paths of many Americans during the Great Depression.
ANSWER: rocky road
 - (b) This flavor, a version of spumoni, was popular in Europe in the early 19th century, and was likely introduced to the US in the 1870s where it took on the tripartite form we know now.
ANSWER: Neapolitan
 - (c) An entrepreneur in Boston; David Strickler in Latrobe, Pennsylvania; and Ernest Hazard of Wilmington, Ohio, all claim its invention around the turn of the century, but there is little doubt that it was popularized by Walgreen's, who made it their signature dish.
ANSWER: banana split

2. Hello, Cleveland! The Browns were one of the busiest shoppers this offseason. Name these newest members of the Dawg Pound, for ten points each.
 - (a) Cleveland's biggest pickup on defense was this longtime Patriots linebacker who is now reunited with current Browns head coach and former New England defensive coordinator Romeo Crennel.
ANSWER: Willie McGinest
 - (b) The Browns also beefed up the offensive line by signing this Saints All-Pro center and former star lineman at Ohio State.
ANSWER: LeCharles Bentley
 - (c) Cleveland got some additional receiving help by signing this former Penn State receiver who led the Seahawks with 10 touchdown catches last season.
ANSWER: Joe Jurevicius

3. Edward D. Wood Jr. made a lot of movies that weren't *Plan 9 From Outer Space*. Which is either a good thing or a bad thing, depending on you feel about crap. For ten points each:
 - (a) Originally titled *I Led Two Lives*, it stars Wood along with Bela Lugosi, Dolores Fuller, Lyle Talbot and Timothy Farrell and was inspired by the life of Christine Jorgenson.
ANSWER: Glen or Glenda
 - (b) This 1955 classic, originally titled *The Atomic Monster* and then *Bride of the Atom*, starred Bela Lugosi as a mad scientist bent on creating a race of atomic supermen. Tor Johnson plays Lugosi's lumbering assistant, Lobo.

 - (c) This Wood opus was filmed in 1959 but wasn't released until 1987, because Wood couldn't afford to process the negatives. A con man, Dr. Acula, played by Kenne Duncan, pretends he can contact the dead. A sequel to *Bride of the Monster*, it also stars Tor Johnson.

14. For ten points each, name these drugs mentioned in *Game of Shadows*:
- (a) This steroid is derived from a drug used to treat endometriosis. It was supposedly offered for use together with a testosterone-based topical cream.
ANSWER: the clear or THG or tetrahydrogestrinone
- (b) According to the book, Barry Bonds used this anabolic steroid which cost Ben Johnson a gold medal in 1988.
ANSWER: Stanozolol or Winstrol
- (c) Also sold under the names Serophone and Milophene, this infertility drug stimulates ovulation in women. Steroid users may employ it to block effects such as gynecomastia and to restore the body's natural testosterone when cycling down.
ANSWER: Clomid or clomifene citrate
15. Identify these subterranean tourist traps, for 10 points each.
- (a) Advertised throughout the Midwest as Jesse James' hideout, these caverns formerly on Route 66 in the Missouri Ozarks features a light and sound show advertised as "the greatest show under the earth".

20. Hitchcock films from director cameos, for ten points each.

- (a) The "before" picture in a newspaper ad for a fad diet called Reduco Obesity Slayer.

ANSWER: **Lifeboat**

- (b) Walking near the phone booth just after George Sanders makes a call.

ANSWER: **Rebecca**

- (c) Leaving the pet shop with two white terriers as Tippi Hedren enters.

ANSWER: The **Birds**

21. Answer these questions about changes and controversies about race cars, for ten points each.

- (a) Starting in 2006, this automaker took over as the sole engine supplier for IRL.

ANSWER: **Honda**

- (b) Honda took over as the sole supplier as this other automaker pulled out of the circuit but will start racing in the Nextel Cup circuit starting in 2007.

ANSWER: **Toyota**

- (c) Also making changes for NASCAR, but for the 2006 season, was Ford, which switched from using the Taurus to this car.

- (b) This 1972 Oscar winner features Michael York as academic Brian Roberts, who becomes the first of many gay men to romance Liza Minelli.

- (c) This 1982 film featured Michael Ontkean as a gay doctor two-timing wife Kate Jackson with a pre-*L.A. Law* Harry Hamlin.

ANSWER: **Making Love**
