

1. In his first professional fight on December 3, 1994, he knocked out Gregory Herrington in the first round. He has made the early finish something of a habit, having garnered 14 first-round KO's in a career that now has his record at 35-2. Prior to last weekend, however, he had never represented himself well in fights against famous boxers, dropping to Oleg Maskaev and David Tua--albeit controversially. FTP, name this Baltimore-based boxer who scored a 5th-round knockout over Lennox Lewis to gain the IBF and WBC heavyweight titles.

Ans: Hasim "The Rock" **Rahman**

2. Originally formed in Santa Barbara, California in the early 1990s, this band's first recording was a full-length tape entitled *Bread and Circus*. That album contained the songs "Way Away" and "Come Back Down" which would appear on a later retrospective called *P.S.*, along with such hits as "Something's Always Wrong," "Crazy Life," and "Fall Down." FTP, what band's most famous album *Fear* spawned the singles "All I Want" and "Walk on the Ocean"?

Ans: **toad the wet sprocket**

3. Consider the following. A song by Pearl Jam featuring a man who is neither a democrat nor a republican, a wrestler who would later be known as Cobra and the Fake Sting, and Andy Katzenmoyer. FTP, what word describes all of these items, along with a type of surface-to-air missile?

Ans: **patriot** (The song by Pearl Jam is sometimes called "I Am A Patriot," so take that answer early.)

4. This Canadian comedian appears in the just-released *Freddy Got Fingered* with fellow countryman Tom Green. Hopefully, this role will allow him to create the same laughs that he did in earlier roles such as the state trooper in *Dumb and Dumber*, in which he drank a bottle of urine he mistook for beer. He also appeared uncredited as the "Seven Minute Abs"-peddling hitchhiker in *There's Something About Mary*, and had a larger role as Kenny Davis in the movie *Half-Baked*. FTP, name this comedian, also known for hosting a season of Comedy Central's *Premium Blend*.

Ans: Harland **Williams**

5. He has a master's degree in folklore and mythology, a fact that he reveals to those freakin' kids when they ask him to part with a valuable item for a mere forty dollars. He asks the actor who provides the voice of Poochie to sign one autograph for himself, and three for his friend of the same name. Interestingly enough, this character has no true name, and is known merely by his occupation. As he visits the site alt dot nerd dot obsessive on the computer at the Android's Dungeon, FTP, what character attempts to reveal the identity of the man playing Radioactive Man to Bart Simpson?

Ans: **Comic Book Guy** (accept obvious equivalents, like "Comic Store Owner" etc.)

6. During some of this team's years as a member of the WHA, they were led by Bobby Hull, who left to play in the NHL. As this Canadian team entered the NHL in 1981, they were led throughout the decade by Dale Hawerchuk, who gave way to Phil Housley upon retirement in 1990. Signing Teemu Selanne and Keith Tkachuk before 1992, they created the nucleus of a team that would later become known as the Screaming Weasels to their original northern fans. FTP, name this team that is now plays in Phoenix as the Coyotes.

Ans: **Winnipeg Jets** (accept either part, accept **Phoenix Coyotes** until "Canadian.")

7. Currently involved in a web-based roleplaying sci-fi storytelling project called *Starshield* which has already spawned a series of novels, this author is best known for his co-written series such as *Rose of the Prophet* and *The Death Gate Cycle*. FTP, what fantasy author was the primary writer for parts involving Tanis Half-Elven in the immensely popular *Dragonlance* novels, coauthored with Margaret Weis?

Ans: Tracy **Hickman**

8. On Hanson's live album, *The Man from Albertane*, this song is the other half of a medley with "Shake a Tail Feather." In the movie *The Blues Brothers*, the patrons of a country & western bar pelt the Blues Brothers with bottles and cans when they start playing this song. FTP, name this song, which in its original version featured "Little Stevie" Winwood on vocals, the biggest hit of the Spencer Davis Group.

Gimme Some Lovin'

9. Drummer Jonny Cragg and guitarist Richard Steel round out the lineup of this band, led by Royston and Antony Langdon, who write the songs. Heavily influenced by such artists as David Bowie and T-Rex, but taking the over-the-top feel of glam rock to a more subtle level, their first major album, *Resident Alien*, spawned their most prominent single. Adopting more of an alternative feel on the subsequent release *The Chinese Album*, they have yet to equal the success of first single "In The Meantime" on the U.S. charts. FTP, what UK band's latest release is *The Hogyssey*?

Ans: **Spacehog**

10. Some believe that this 1991 movie's villain, Neville Sinclair, was based on Errol Flynn, who was suspected for a time of being a Nazi spy. Timothy Dalton's Sinclair actually does sympathize with Nazis, and as such becomes an enemy of Cliff Secord, who rises to prominence after he discovers Peevy's important invention. FTP, name this movie based on a comic book and you will also name Secord's superhero name.

Ans: **The Rocketeer**

11. Prior to 1999, this player had managed to hit .300 only once in his professional career. In that year, 1993, he put up an unimpressive 15 home runs, which was indicative of a chronic lack of power shown throughout his early career with the Astros and later stints with the Cubs and Tigers. As this outfielder was pretty much a player well below the league average, the Astros thought nothing of it when the Diamondbacks signed him in 1999, upon which he promptly became a legitimate .300 hitter with 26 home runs and 111 RBIs. FTP, name this player who has flourished in the desert, and who through 18 games in 2001 had already hit 11 home runs.

Ans: **Luis Gonzalez**

12. This video opens with Jason Finn, Dave Dederer, and Chris Ballew playing their instruments and singing in a serene grove, apparently about undertaking a more rural lifestyle. After the end of the second verse, however, whatever meaning to the song the video may have had is lost, as a group of black-clad ninjas storm into the grove and attack the band, meeting their demise. FTP, this synopsis describes what video for a song about fruit by the Presidents of the United States of America?

Ans: **Peaches**

13. In the somewhat politically incorrect days of the 1970s, this actor made his film debut as a character called "Interracial Lover" in *What Do You Say to a Naked Lady?* Late in his career, he made money appearing as police chief types in low-budget action flicks like *A Time to Die* and *The Banker*. He has apparently accepted, however, that he will always be known as a sort of black superguy, even taking a role in a remake of his most famous film. FTP, name this actor who appeared in *Earthquake* three years after the release of *Shaft*.

Ans: **Richard Roundtree**

14. *Jurassic Park 2: Revenge of the Raptors*, *Honey, I Ate The Kids*, *Apocalypse Wow!*, *Edward Plungerhands*, and *Crocodile Gandhi* are all movie parodies reviewed on the fictitious show *Coming Attractions*, which serves as the centerpiece for this program. The memorable characters on the program were voiced by the Simpsons' Nancy Cartwright, *Babe's* Christine Cavanaugh, and experienced actor Charles Napier, who provided the voice of Duke Phillips. FTP, what show also featured a morbidly obese Pulitzer Prize-winning Jay Sherman, voiced by Jon Lovitz?

Ans: **The Critic**

15. He finished second in the 60-meter dash in the Big Ten Championships in 1999. As a fifth-round pick in the 2001 NFL Draft, he was the third player selected from his college and the 16th wide receiver taken overall. As a star returner and receiver in college, he was the most frequent recipient of Drew Brees' passes in 2000. FTP, name this star wideout for the Purdue Boilermakers, hired to replace Tim Dwight as the Atlanta Falcons' kick returner and deep threat.

Ans: Vinny **Sutherland**

16. The title object of this song is purchased by a woman in a town that is full of them. The lyrics are populated by a cosmetic surgeon defeated by gravity and the narrator's own artificial lover. The refrain "it wears me out" depicts the grind of modernity in, FTP, what song written by Thom Yorke and recorded by Radiohead?

Ans: "**Fake Plastic Trees**"

17. In the 1998 movie *Rounders*, she portrays Petra, a tough poker-playing woman who is the former love interest of protagonist Mike McDermott. Her feature film debut was with Jeff Goldblum in 1992's ill-fated *Fathers and Sons*, but she received her first major role in a truly major film in 1995's *Goldeneye* as femme fatale Xenia Onatopp. FTP, name this sexy Dutch brunette, who made her biggest break as Dr. Jean Grey in 2001's *X-Men*.

Ans: Famke **Janssen**

18. In the movie *High Fidelity*, this group's "Radiation Ruling the Nation" is placed fifth on Rob's All Time Top Five Track Ones. "Radiation" is a remix of the group's biggest U.S. hit, "Protection". *No Protection and Protection* are both albums by, FTP, what British trip-hop band?

Ans: **Massive Attack**

19. He is the Sacramento Kings' all-time leader in free throw percentage, and ranks third on the Atlanta Hawks' list in the same category. He used his 45-inch vertical leap and proportionally long arms to make up the four foot-five inch gap between the top of his head and the bottom of the rim, and defeated teammate Dominique Wilkins in the 1986 Slam Dunk Competition. FTP, who is this former point guard, known for his mantra "I don't play small?"

Ans: Anthony "Spud" **Webb**

20. He will appear in the 2001 release *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone* as Professor Severus Snape. The only movie written and directed by this Brit was 1997's acclaimed *The Winter Guest*, which featured Emma Thompson and garnered a Gold Hugo at the Chicago International Film Festival. He made his major film debut as Hans Gruber in *Die Hard*. FTP, name this actor who portrayed the Sheriff of Nottingham in *Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves*, before appearing as Metatron in Kevin Smith's *Dogma*.

Ans: Alan **Rickman**

21. Until Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold committed the massacre at Columbine High School, he was the most notorious resident of Littleton, Colorado. He might not have attained his notoriety, if he had followed the advice of Ute Indian Chief Ouray and decided against leading five prospectors into the snow near Breckenridge, Colorado where he allegedly ate them all for dinner. FTP, name this man, the only man ever convicted of murder by cannibalism in the United States.

Alferd or Alfred **Packer**

22. After being harassed by the press about her weight at the 1997 Golden Globes, she replied, "I am a woman and I have boobs and a bum. I'm probably 60 kilograms, but I haven't checked." Married to assistant director Jim Threapleton, she made her debut in 1994 as a quasi-lesbian Catholic schoolgirl in the film *Heavenly Creatures*. FTP, name this actress who later won an Oscar nomination for appearing opposite Leonardo DiCaprio in *Titanic*.

Kate Winslet

23. Actresses who have played this character include Geri Reischl, Melanie Hutsell, and Jennifer Elise Cox. Unlucky with the opposite sex, she tried removing her freckles with a lemon and inventing an imaginary boyfriend named George Glass. FTP, name this TV character played by Eve Plumb known for her rivalry with her sister "Marcia, Marcia, Marcia."

Bonus Questions from Emory and the Lords of the Underworld

1. The films of Orson Welles were ground-breaking and cinematically marvelous, with a few quite notable exceptions. Identify the following projects with which a geriatric Welles was unfortunately associated, for the stated number of points.

A. 5 points: In 1986, Welles provided the voice of the all-consuming planetary body known as Unicron, which presumably weighed only slightly more than Welles.

Ans: **Transformers: The Movie**

B. 10 points: Welles played a character named Klingsor in this very strange 1983 Tony Curtis movie, which centered around an eccentric inventor named for a Wagnerian/Arthurian character.

Ans: **Where is Parsifal?**

C. 15 points: As Judge Rauch, Welles presided over the trial of Jess Tyler in this 1981 James M. Cain adaptation centering around the sensual Kady, played by the eminent Pia Zadora.

Ans: **Butterfly**

2. Identify the following musical woman from clues, on a 30-20-10-5-1 basis.

30-Her first single off her latest album is called "Walk the Walk," which is one of many songs on the album that in some way refers to her late father.

20-That album, *Haunted*, is a follow-up release to 1995's *Hello*, which spawned her first major single, "Trigger Happy Jack."

10-*Hello* included her most famous song, "Angry Johnny," which was a haunting track that had her occupying the role of "Jezebel in hell."

5-She takes her stage name from her fascination with the author of a short story about Prince Prospero.

1-That story is "The Masque of the Red Death," and it was written by Edgar Allan Poe, whose last name she uses as her stage name.

Ans: **Poe**

3. Do you know some ACC basketball? This glorious conference has, at times, been stained by the actions of a few tragic and/or idiotic individuals. Identify the following players who perpetuated some of the lowlights in the history of that storied conference for ten points each.

A. After leaving a national runner-up team in 1999, for which he was a *freshman reserve*, to declare for the NBA Draft, this athletic swingman cost Duke their NCAA tournament finish when it was revealed that he took money from aptly-named AAU coach Myron Piggie. May he be condemned to the Clippers for all eternity.

Ans: **Corey Maggette**

B. A perfect shooting night in a particularly close game in the NCAA Tournament didn't excuse the fact that this power forward received a technical foul for literally *stepping on* an opposing player. This is still a unique incident in ACC lore.

Ans: **Christian Laettner** (played for Duke)

C. This superstar was a lottery pick for the Boston Celtics, but died the night of the NBA Draft from a cocaine overdose. Because he possessed an otherwise spotless character record and an infectious smile, his death is regarded as one of the greatest tragedies in basketball history.

Ans: **Len Bias** (played for Maryland)

4. If you are a fan of the fantasy/sci-fi movie genre, you know that certain actors have frequently popped up in big movies. Given one role or collection of roles for ten points or two roles or collections of roles for five, identify the following fantasy/sci-fi actors and actresses.

A. 10-He will Appear as Elrond in the new *Lord of the Rings* trilogy.

5-He is perhaps best known as the somber but very intimidating Agent Smith from *The Matrix*.

Ans: **Hugo Weaving**

B. 10-Though perhaps not well-known for doing so, he provided the voice of General James "Paladin" Taggart in several *Wing Commander* video games. He will appear as Gimli in *The Lord of the Rings*.

5-He is also famous for his portrayal of portly Egyptian archeologist Sallah in *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade* and *Raiders of the Lost Ark*.

Ans: **John Rhys-Davies**

C. 10-He will play the aging wizard Saruman in *The Lord of the Rings*, and will appear as Count Dooku in the much-awaited *Star Wars: Episode II*.

5-He gained much fame for his portrayal of Dracula in 1958's version of that film, and is very well-known for portraying Bond villain Scaramanga in *The Man With the Golden Gun*.

Ans: **Christopher Lee**

5. The PlayStation 1 Era may have officially come to a close at this point, but many games for that system epitomized various gaming genres. Identify the following PlayStation games from clues for the stated number of points.

A. 5 points-This Konami action game brought the cinema sequence to new heights, as the story of the hero Snake was developed extensively with dramatic voice-acting and cutscenes.

Ans: **Metal Gear: Solid**

B. 10 points-Probably the first truly great skateboarding game ever, this ActiVision release featured ten real-life skaters who, in Career Mode, collected videotapes to clear each level.

Ans: **Tony Hawk's Pro Skater**

C. 15 points-Featuring such characters as Red Shadow, this SquareSoft fighting game rejected life bars in favor of a more active instant-death system. This was perhaps appropriate due to the lethal katana and no-dachi utilized by the combatants.

Ans: **Bushido Blade** (Bushido Blade 2 is also correct)

6. Far, far too many academic teamers are familiar with wrestling stars who have gained fame in the current era. For that reason, we at Emory University who consider ourselves wrestling fans (read, Steve Bahnaman) have decided to ask this bonus about earlier wrestling stars. On a 10-5 basis, identify the following earlier wrestling stars.

A. 10--He is the son of a wrestler known as "Iron Mike." The Undertaker entered the WWF as a member of a team captained by him at the 1990 Survivor Series. Some of his signature moves were the Fist Drop and the Powerslam.

5--He held the tag team titles as a member of Money, Inc. with Mike Rotundo a.k.a. I.R.S. His finisher was the Million Dollar Dream.

Ans: **Ted DiBiase** (prompt on "Million Dollar Man")

B. 10--At that same 1990 Survivor Series, this wrestler was the only teammate of Hulk Hogan and the Ultimate Warrior in the Match of Survival. He had gained earlier fame as a member of the tag team Strike Force, with Rick Martel.

5--His finishing move was a flying forearm called the Mexican Hammer. Later in his career, he tried the ill-fated gimmick "El Matador," and soon found himself out of the WWF.

Ans: **Tito Santana**

C. 10--A famous member of a family of wrestlers who died young, he fought on a team with the Ultimate Warrior at that fateful 1990 Survivor Series, when he was the WWF Intercontinental Champion.

5--Known as the "Texas Tornado," his finishing maneuver was the kind-of-silly Tornado Punch, which consisted of spinning around once and punching your opponent. Fortunately, he also used the Iron Claw.

Ans: **Kerry Von Erich** (prompt on "Texas Tornado")

7. Sometimes indecipherable, John Michael Stipe of R.E.M. is still capable of penning some of the more beautiful lines of verse to populate the radio waves. Identify the following songs by R.E.M. given quotes from them, for the stated number of points.

A. 5 points: "I see today with a newsprint fray / My night is colored headache grey / Don't wake me with so much."

Ans: **Daysleeper**

B. 10 points: "There's a problem, feathers iron / Bargain buildings, weights and pulleys / Feathers hit the ground before the weight can leave the air."

Ans: **Fall on Me** (This is not to be confused with "Orange Crush" whose refrain is "Fall on Me, Don't Fall on Me.")

C. 15 points: "The bus ride, I went to write this, 4 a.m., this letter / Fields of poppies, little pearls / All the boys and all the girls sweet-toothed / each and every one a little scary."

Ans: **E-Bow the Letter**

8. Identify the following members of Swedish National Hockey Teams who gave up the progressive social programs and recognized homosexual marriage of their native country to pursue careers in the NHL, for ten points each.

A. Called by nhl.com "the best two-way defenseman in the NHL," this Detroit Red Wings blue-liner is one of the cleanest defensemen in hockey.

Ans: Nicklas **Lidstrom**

B. A longtime Washington Capital, this fluid-skating Swede would make a wonderful tandem with Lidstrom, wearing jersey number 6 to Lidstrom's 5.

Ans: Calle **Johansson**

C. Having made his second straight All-Star appearance in 1999, this Vancouver winger was second only to Peter Forsberg in points among NHL Swedes in 2000.

Ans: Markus **Naslund**

9. We at Emory University feel that too many questions are asked about the very funny but very over-talked-about *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*. As such, answer the following questions about Monty Python's even better movie, *The Life of Brian*, for the stated number of points.

A. For five points, which Pythonian plays the title role in this opus?

Ans: Graham **Chapman**

B. For ten points, what was the name of Pontius Pilate's friend from Rome who spoke with a lisp, also played by Graham Chapman?

Ans: **Bigus Dickus**

C. Many different Jewish resistance movements with similar names are involved in the movie. For ten points, which movement does Brian join?

Ans: The **People's Front of Judea** (or **PFJ**) (Do not accept "Judean People's Front" or "Popular Front of Judea" or "Judean Popular People's Front")

D. For five points, what English phrase is Brian trying to write in the town square when he mistranslates it into Latin?

Ans: "**Romans Go Home**" (he writes "Romanes Eunt Domus" which means "People who are called Romans they go the house.")

10. When we at Emory University decide to drink alcohol, many of us drink anything in sight. Steve, on the other hand, is partial to drinking vodka in various mixtures, and as such is presenting you with the following bonus on vodka cocktails. 11. Many musical acts use live shows as a way to pay tribute to earlier influences. Identify the following covers made famous by later performances on MTV Unplugged for ten points each.

A. 10,000 Maniacs scored massive airplay with their splendid cover of this Springsteen-penned Patti Smith hit, which includes the repeated phrase "They can't hurt you now."

Ans: **Because the Night**

B. The most famous Unplugged performance of all included a soon-to-be-deceased lead singer's rendition of this Lead Belly song. It answers the title question with the words "In the pines, in the pines, where the sun don't ever shine."

Ans: **Where Did you Sleep Last Night?** (recorded by Nirvana on Unplugged)

C. In their Unplugged performance, the band Live covered a song by paraplegic Athens, GA folk singer Vic Chesnutt. The title is a 5-syllable adjective.

Ans: **Supernatural**

12. Identify each of the following current NFL franchises based on a history of its name, according to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, for ten points each.

A. This franchise's name was changed from the Spartans after radio executive George A. Richards purchased the team and moved it from Portsmouth, Ohio in 1934.

Ans: **Detroit** or **Lions** (accept either part)

B. Once actually called the Staleys, this charter member of the APFA/NFL changed its name to a more intimidating one in 1922, on the request of its new owner and star end.

Ans: **Chicago** or **Bears** (accept either part) (Note: That owner was George Halas.)

C. When this AFL team moved from Dallas, it made no sense to keep the name Texans. For that reason, the now-common practice of choosing the name in a fan poll was invoked (though not for the first time). The fans chose a name that implies superiority.

Ans: **Kansas City** or **Chiefs** (accept either part)

13. Once again exhibiting our refined tastes in cinema, we at Emory would like you to identify the following Steven Seagal films from clues for ten points each. For a hint, all of these movie titles have prepositions as their first word.

A. The first movie in which Seagal starred as Navy cook Casey Ryback, this movie had him kicking terrorist butt aboard a Navy battleship.

Ans: **Under Siege**

B. Seagal's first starring role was in this film, in which he plays martial arts-trained Nico Toscani. He uncovers a CIA drug deal involving C4 explosives and is forced to kick ex-Secret Service butt.

Ans: **Above the Law**

C. This very bad 1994 movie had Seagal playing a mystical environmental agent named Forrest Taft. He must fight against one-dimensional, greedy corporate types in order to save the land. Interestingly enough, the evil oil-mongering baron who serves as this movie's villain is played by the talented Michael Caine.

Ans: **On Deadly Ground**

14. Identify the following character (from what, I'm not telling) on a 30-20-10-5 basis.

30-As the story begins, he is the captain of the Red Wings.

20-Those Red Wings are a force of airships, which steal the Crystal of Water from Mysidia. This character is, at the time, a black knight.

10-After fighting Milon on Mount Ordeal, he gains the abilities of a Paladin and sheds his mask for the remainder of the game.

5-He is the protagonist of Final Fantasy II, on Super Nintendo.

Ans: **Cecil**

15. Identify the following songs that may or may not have to do with superheroes and superheroines for ten points each from clues, or five points if you need the artist who recorded it.

A. 10 points--It contains such famous figures as Person Man

5 points--The song is by They Might Be Giants.

Ans: **Particle Man**

B. 10 points--It mentions its album's title, "Pocket Full of Kryptonite," as its title character laments his rejection by a certain journalist.

5 points--The song is by the Spin Doctors.

Ans: **Jimmy Olsen's Blues** (Accept "Jimmy Olsen Blues" if you're feeling generous. Jimmy feels rejected by Lois Lane in favor of that blue-clad jerk Superman.)

C. 10 points--His daddy's a lazy middle class intellectual most likely not named Charley Steinhice, and his mommy's on valium and so ineffectual.

5 points--The song is by Bad Religion.

Ans: **21st Century (Digital Boy)**

16. The Internet Movie Database has been used by countless Academic Team players looking for random facts about movies like *The Rocketeer* and *Transformers*. Their list of the Top 250 is somewhat reputable, but is marred by a few movies that just don't belong. Given a director and a release year, as well as its somewhat meaningless position on the list as of April 23, identify the following films that dubiously occupy top 100 spots in IMDB's Top 250, for five points each.

A. Christopher Nolan, 2000. It is 35th.

Ans: **Memento**

B. Ash Brannon and John Lasseter, 1999. It is 36th.

Ans: **Toy Story 2**

C. Nick Park, 1993. It is 47th.

Ans: Wallace and Gromit: **The Wrong Trousers**

D. Tom Tykwer, 1998. It is 69th.

Ans: **Run Lola Run**

E. Darren Aronofsky, 2000. It is 74th.

Ans: **Requiem for a Dream**

F. David Fincher, 1995. It is 86th.

Ans: **Se7en** (Pronounced "Seven")

(Reader's Note: We at Emory University greatly enjoy most of these movies, but do not think that they are part of the Top 100 Movies of All Time. Seriously.)

17. Identify the following women basketball players, who performed well on teams that went deep into the 2001 NCAA Tournament, drafted in the 2001 WNBA Draft for ten points each.

A. This Notre Dame center, Final Four MVP, and Naismith Award Winner was selected fifth in the draft by the Miami Sol.

Ans: **Ruth Riley**
