

1. Had Dick Ebersol perished in the tragic plane crash that killed one of his sons, there would be only one person left alive known to possess the secret to this. In 2003 Ebersol paid \$50,000 to learn the identity of the subject of this song. Maybe Ebersol would not have had to shell out the cash if he could have figured out who had a winning horse at Saratoga, or who had flown a Lear jet up to Nova Scotia to see the total eclipse of the sun. Suspects include Kris Kristofferson, Cat Stevens, and Mick Jagger; but most believe the subject of this song is Warren Beatty. Whoever it is, he probably thinks this song is about him. FTP, name this 1972 song by Carly Simon.

Answer: **“You’re So Vain”** (Prompt on Carly Simon before end of first sentence.)

*EDITOR’S NOTE: Your genial quizmaster’s long-held theory is that the song contains clues to several of Ms. Simon’s former lovers, and that the joke is on them because each of them DOES think the song is about him alone.*

2. She was born in Wisconsin and abandoned as a child. Afterwards, she was adopted by the Noodlemans, Kansas farmers, who named her Claire after the missing family cat. She married Robert Evans for a month and was responsible for the closing of Studio 54. As a model, she gained the nickname “The Gotcha Girl” and was named Top Model in 1974. After her modeling career fizzled, she took a job dressing as a mermaid to display a boat. While on that job, her old friend Jack Gallo saw her and gave her a job as Fashion Editor of *Blush* magazine. FTP, name this character played by Wendie Malick on “Just Shoot Me”.

Answer: **Nina and/or Van Horn**

3. He has said, “My mom’s 100% Irish, and in my family we’ve always called acting ‘blarney.’” His last name is Romansch, though. At a May 2003 commencement at King’s College in Pennsylvania, he received an honorary degree, and gave a “fire and brimstone” speech. He refused to do a love scene with Ashley Judd in *High Crimes* because the possibility of nudity offended his religious beliefs. FTP, name this actor, who in a Faulknerian coincidence, shares his initials with the main character he plays in a 2004 Mel Gibson-directed film.

Answer: **James or Jim Caviezel**

4. He was born September 13, 1971 in Split, Croatia. He turned pro in 1988, but lost in the first round at Wimbledon. In 1990 he reached the semis at the All-England Club, losing to Boris Becker. He was the victim of Andre Agassi’s first Grand Slam victory, losing to Agassi in the finals of Wimbledon in 1992. He lost in the Wimbledon finals again in 1994 to Sampras. FTP, name this tall, lanky, hard serving lefthander, who finally broke through to win his one and only Grand Slam title, defeating Patrick Rafter at Wimbledon in 5 sets in 2001.

Answer: **Goran Ivanisevic**

5. Developed by NASA to relieve the g-forces of lift-off for astronauts, this product works by becoming softer in warmer areas and remaining firmer in cooler areas, thus distributing pressure evenly over the entire surface. Its viscoelastic quality allows it to return to its original shape once the pressure is removed. For ten points, name this product that promises to give you the support you need to experience deep, rejuvenating and therapeutic sleep, available in mattress and pillow forms.

Answer: **TEMPUR or TEMPUR-pedic**

6. In a 1980s commercial for this, a cool kid named Johnny walks into a crowd, hands his jacket to a lucky girl, and proceeds to play this while the crowd gathers around to watch. Now, there is a smaller hand held version, an Electronic Space Battle version, and a version 2, which looks much like the original on one side, but can be flipped to the other side to play four more games. FTP, what is this toy made by Hasbro, a circle with red, blue, yellow, and green panels, which light in patterns for the player to copy?

Answer: **Simon**

7. The first woman to take this identity discovered that she was the reincarnation of the Egyptian Chay-Ara, and was able to fly via a device made of the Ninth Metal. Her spirit presently resides in Kendra Sheira Sanders, who has also taken the name. The current cartoon portrayal of this character is based on the Thanagarian version. FTP, name this winged avenger from DC Comics, companion to Hawkman.

Answer: **Hawkgirl** (Accept Hawkwoman before “also taken the name”)

8. An aeronautical engineer, he works for Universal Research and Design Inc. as a structural design consultant. He graduated from Midwest University, and married Louise O'Casey when he was 21. Sadly, Louise died the night before her and his youngest son's first birthday. He asked his father-in-law to move in to help with kids. His kids couldn't pronounce grandpa, so they called their grandpa "Bub". When Bub disappeared, he asked Uncle Charlie to move in. FTP, name this father of Mike, Rob, and Chip played by Fred MacMurray on "My Three Sons", who as far as we know, never debated Lincoln.

Answer: **Steve or Douglas** (Accept Steven)

9. Quote: "Should have been different, but it wasn't different, was same old story, Dear John, and so long. Should have fit like a glove, should have fit like a ring, like a diamond ring, a token of true love. Should have all worked out, but it didn't. She should be here now, but she isn't." FTP, supply the next three words, and you've named this fourth track off of *Wide Open Spaces* by The Dixie Chicks.

Answer: **There's Your Trouble** (Prompt on The Dixie Chicks before the end.)

10. It was the name of the main fort on "F-Troop". It was the name of a pet owned by Muriel and Eustace Bagg. For one week in September 1986, it was how Dan Rather signed off the CBS Evening News. Also, it's what makes a king out of a slave, what makes the flag on the mast to wave, what makes the elephant charge his tusk in the misty mist or the dusky dusk, and FTP, what is this, that according to the Cowardly Lion, is what others got that he don't got?

Answer: **Courage**

11. Ratted out by his own son, he learned his sentence on the same day that the guilty verdict came down against Martha Stewart. Like Martha, he had been charged of a white-collar crime, but he plead guilty to keep his case out of Federal Court, and try to avoid jail time on the advice of prosecutor Christine Williams. Specifically, he was charged with commercial bribery for paying retailers to display his company's cosmetics more prominently than the products of his competitor, Jabot. FTP, name this character, the founder and CEO of his namesake company, played by Eric Braeden on "The Young and the Restless".

Answer: **Victor or Newman** (Prompt on "The Black Knight" or "The Mustache")

12. In an interview on *Late Night*, Rachel Dratch explained that she and others at the Upright Citizens Brigade had been reenacting scenes from this movie. Dratch then read the part of Steff, while Conan read the part of Andie from one of this movie's scenes. During the 2004 People's Choice Awards an audience member screamed the name of the character one of the co-hosts played in this movie. To which that co-host replied, "It was made in 1986 already!" FTP, name this movie about a girl from the wrong side of the tracks, a hunk, and a geek named "Duckie" directed by John Hughes.

Answer: **Pretty in Pink**

13. These were developed by James Welch, brother of Sugar Daddy and John Birch Society creator Robert Welch. Named after James's favorite Broadway show, they entered the market in 1949. Along with Sugar Daddy, Sugar Babies, and Charleston Chew, they were acquired in 1993 from the Warner Lambert Company by Tootsie Roll Industries. On *Seinfeld*, during a struggle between Kramer and Jerry, one falls from a surgery viewing box into the patient on the operating table. FTP, name this popular movie theater candy that has a creamy certain-flavored center, covered in dark chocolate.

Answer: **Junior Mints** (Note: The Broadway show was "Junior Miss".)

14. After its authors' Oprah Show appearance, this book had to be sent back to the printers six times and in September, hit number one on Amazon's bestseller list. Chapters include, "If He's Not Calling You," "If He's Not Having Sex With You," and "If He's Disappeared on You." The idea for the book came when the authors Greg Behrendt and Liz Tuccillo were discussing why men make excuses instead of continuing a relationship. For ten points, name this book that got its name from an episode of "Sex and the City" in which Miranda learns why her date kisses her but doesn't stay the night.

Answer: **He's Just Not That Into You**

15. Blue Cross Blue Shield of Florida announced in March 2004 that this procedure will no longer be covered. The insurer says that about 3 out of every 1000 people who have it die as a result, and that 20 percent need a follow-up procedure. Actor Michael Genard, Comedian Ralphie May, John Popper, Roseanne, Carnie Wilson, and Al Roker have all had it. FTP, what is this surgery that limits a person's food intake and calorie absorption, which helps the severely obese lose weight quickly?

Answer: **Gastric Bypass Surgery** (Accept "Stomach Stapling" or "Stomach Banding".)

16. At the beginning of this movie, the main character returns home for a reunion, and his father asks him if he wants to watch golf on television. In this movie, Willie compares his father's next-door neighbor, Marty, to Christopher Robin, and she in turn begins calling him Pooh. Willie is a piano player, and he and his friends break into a rendition of "Sweet Caroline" while at a bar. FTP, name this 1996 movie in which Timothy Hutton plays Willie, but which is probably named for the characters played by Annabeth Gish, Lauren Holly, Mira Sorvino, Natalie Portman, Uma Thurman, and others like them.

Answer: **Beautiful Girls**

17. He played his high school ball from 1964 to 1968 at Roosevelt High School in New York. Despite only playing two seasons in college, where he started every game, he holds or shares 14 records at the University of Massachusetts. After college, he played in the ABA with the Virginia Squires from 1971 to 1973, and with the New York Nets from 1973 to 1976. In 1976, coincidentally, he moved into the NBA to the team with which he is most associated. FTP, name this forward, who scored over 30,000 career points as a pro, and played from 1976 to 1987 with the Philadelphia 76ers.

Answer: **Julius Erving** (Accept Dr. J.)

18. Planet Smoothie founder Martin Sprock started this in December 2000. Sprock would fit right in at a trash tournament, judging by the rampant references to pop culture such as "Joey Bag o'Donuts", "Art Vandalay", "Pinky Tuscadero", and "Ugly Naked Guy" naming some of the menu choices, and the portraits of departed musicians on the wall, who have their songs played while you eat. FTP, name this fresh Southwest grill, where the staff shouts a welcome to you, which shares its name with a tavern owned by Mr. Szyslak.

Answer: **Moe's**

19. On the 2004 Grammys, he sat in for Ringo Starr, playing drums during the tribute to The Beatles. He and his longtime collaborator have teamed up with a Virginia Beach area high school friend named Shae Haley to release the album *In Search Of* in 2002, and the album *Fly or Die* in March 2004. At the Source and Billboard awards in 2002, along with his partner Chad Hugo, he was named producer of the year. He is featured using his falsetto voice on Snoop Dog's "Beautiful", and uses it on his own hit "Frontin'". FTP, name this writer/producer/performer, who makes up part of The Neptunes and N.E.R.D.

Answer: **Pharrell or Williams**

20. Some of this school's current alumni in the NFL include Zeron Flemister, Damien Robinson, and Ross Verba. 1985 was the most recent season in which they won their conference outright. In the resulting Rose Bowl, Ronnie Harmon fumbled four times in the first half, leading to a 45-28 loss to UCLA. The mid-90s saw team records in single-season rushing, career rushing, and career receiving yards fall to Tavian Banks, Sedrick Shaw, and Tim Dwight respectively. However, a 3-8 season in 1998 led to the resignation of their longtime coach, Hayden Fry. FTP, name this Big Ten team currently coached by Kirk Ferentz.

Answer: University of **Iowa**

21. She was played by Bonita Granville in four movies in the 1930's. In the 1970's, she was played on TV by Pamela Sue Martin, and later, by others. Her friends include the athletic George Fayne, and her cousin, the cautious Bess Marvin. She drives a convertible, and lives with her housekeeper, Hanna Gruen, and her attorney father, Carson, in the town of River Heights. FTP, name this heroine of *The Secret of the Old Clock*, *The Hidden Staircase*, and many more books in a series of mysteries credited to the pseudonym Carolyn Keene.

Answer: **Nancy Drew** (Prompt on partial answer.)

22. Born September 20, 1948 in Bayonne, New Jersey, he received his Bachelors and Masters in Journalism from Northwestern. At age 21, he sold his short story, "The Hero" to the "Galaxy," beginning his professional writing career. He then became a journalism instructor at Clarke College from 1976-1978. In 1986 he began work as a story editor for "Twilight Zone" and then as executive story consultant for "Beauty and the Beast" eventually becoming co-supervising producer for the show. For ten points name this author of such works as "Fevre Dream" and "The Armageddon Rag" as well as the saga "A Song of Ice and Fire", "who shares his first and last names with a legendary producer of The Beatles.

Answer: **George Raymond Richard Martin**

23. This format hasn't generated much interest though it has been used for such movies as *Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl* and *Bridget Jones's Diary*. A new ploy to make it more mainstream involves the Christmas flick *Noel*, which will be released on a few dozen screens, on TNT once, and then on Amazon.com. For ten points identify this technology that uses a disc that contains a chemical making the playable surface dark red that when exposed to air becomes darker until it is so opaque that the laser can no longer read the disc.

Answer: **EZ-D** or **Disposable DVD** (accept equivalents)

For 10, after being asked for a challenge, Billy Crystal's character asks what is the perfect ice cream to follow a meal of sea bass--sautéed, potatoes au gratin, and asparagus. What is the response?

Answer: **Rum Raisin** (Moderator: If the team is correct, yell "Woof!")

For 5 for one, or 15 for both, name the actors who played the Shalowitz brothers – one who played against type as mob boss Jonah Malloy on the TV series *Line of Fire*, the other still less familiar than his dad despite such eclectic roles as Herod in *Jesus Christ Superstar*.

Answer: **David Paymer** and **Josh Mostel** [prompt on Mostel]

3. Well, it's hard to believe that it's been ten years since O.J. loved Nicole and Ron too much. Answer these questions about people who worked back then for the channel that O.J. put on the map, Court TV, FTPE.

This white-haired Head Anchor had previously come to prominence covering the Watergate hearings for CBS. He is still with Court TV.

Answer: **Fred Graham**

Now the chief legal analyst for NBC, he has his own show on MSNBC named "The (BLANK) Report".

Answer: **Dan Abrams**

He anchored nightly coverage of the O.J. Trial for Court TV and now works for ABC news where has covered the Gore campaign, the white house, and has filled in on World News Tonight.

Answer: **Terry Moran**

Before his 1973 death near Natchitoches, LA, his forté was lively blue collar stuff like "You Don't Mess Around with Jim," but his reputation was sent to the elevators with posthumous hit ballads like "Time in a Bottle."

Answer: Jim **Croce**

8. Answer these questions about high school sports powerhouses FTPE.

This private school located in Mouth of Wilson, Virginia, which is frequently rated near the top in the country in basketball, has had NBA stars like Ron Mercer, Jerry Stackhouse, and Carmelo Anthony come through its doors.

Answer: **Oak Hill Academy**

Permian who? With over 800 wins, this Georgia high school has the winningest football program in the country. Alumni include former University of Georgia quarterback Buck Belue and NFL placekicker Todd Peterson.

Answer: **Valdosta High School**

Though Tennessee's Dobyns-Bennett High School is not far behind in second, this Illinois high school has the most all-time wins in boys' basketball in the country.

For 10, what school was the last to go undefeated wire to wire, winning the NCAA championship in 1976?

Answer: **Indiana University**

14. The year 1939 is proclaimed by many to have been Hollywood's best year, with several classics being released then. Answer these questions about the Academy Awards for the movies released in the year 1939 FTSNOP.

For 5, this film won eight Oscars including Best Picture.

Answer: **Gone with the Wind**

For 10, Clark Gable did not win Best Actor for portraying Rhett Butler. Rather, Robert Donat won that Oscar for the title role in this film.

Answer: **Goodbye, Mr. Chips**

For 10, Interestingly, this man, who played Gerald O'Hara—Scarlett's father, won the best supporting actor Oscar, not for *Gone With the Wind*, but for his role in *Stagecoach*.

For 5, This 1939 release got nominations for Best Picture, director Frank Capra, and stars Jimmy Stewart, Harry Carey, and Claude Rains. Shoved to the back burner by *GWTW*'s success, it managed just one Oscar, for Original Screenplay.

Answer: **Mr. Smith Goes to Washington**

15. Remember He-man's sister She-ra? Answer these questions about her and her friends FTPE.

She is the alter ego of She-ra.

Answer: Princess **Adora**

This creature was Orko's counterpart. He was yellow with big ears; the toy version would answer questions like a magic eight ball on his stomach.

Answer: **Kowl**

This little dude would be hidden in a scene of the cartoon. After the show, he'd appear and reveal where he was hidden in case you didn't spot him.

Answer: **Lookie**

What media conglomerate, which owns CBS, Nickelodeon, TV Land, and others channels, had those channels pulled for the short span?

What Chairman and C.E.O. of CBS joked the matter was resolved by sending in the guys from New Jersey?
