Questions by Jason Keller, Billy Beyer, Matt Bruce, a lot of people at DePauw, and your genial quizmaster

1. He was the highest-ranked player to defeat Roger Federer this year, doing so at the ABN AMRO Open in Rotterdam. Three weeks later, Federer beat him back, but he took out Andy Roddick en route to the finals of Indian Wells. Highlights of his season have come in Grand Slams: he made Guillermo Coria “look ordinary for a set-and-a-half” during a loss in the semifinals at Roland Garros, and he also made semifinal exit at the US Open, but, for 10 points, what Brit’s season may be considered a disappointment because he only reached the quarterfinals of Wimbledon?

Answer: **Tim Henman**

2. He once had a crush on a girl named Loretta although he's more remembered for his on-again/off-again relationship with Bebe Bluff. Having a mischievous little brother named Dale who is difficult to babysit, he is actually a genius, which earned him the respect of Al and Mo Sleech. His hobbies include air guitar, hanging at the Honker Burger, and listening to The Beets. For ten points -- name this blue-skinned best friend of Doug Funnie.

Answer: **Skeeter and/or Valentine**

3. Grace Episcopal Church, on its namesake avenue, is located a block east of the King Manor, the oldest house in this neighborhood. In 1920, a King Kullen opened there: the first supermarket in the U.S. Rocco DiSpirito currently resides there, though it is more notorious for holding the studio at which Jam Master Jay was executed and being the birthplace of 50 Cent. For 10 points, name this section of New York City, which shares its name with a Caribbean island.

Answer: **Jamaica, Queens**

4. You can recognize several faces in unbilled bit parts, including Victor Buono, Leonard Nimoy, and John Houseman as the admiral confronted by Martin Balsam. The screenwriters turned a minor character from the book, ditzzy socialite Eleanor Holbrook, into a romantic subplot with Ava Gardner in the role. Fredric March plays the embattled President, while Kirk Douglas shines as a Marine Lt. Colonel who puts duty and the Constitution ahead of his own political opinions -- kind of the opposite of Oliver North. FTP name this 1964 John Frankenheimer drama, with Burt Lancaster in a rare villain’s role as the organizer of a military coup.

Answer: **Seven Days in May.**

5. At the behest of Sam Perkins, in 1998, he collaborated with members of Quiet Riot on a rendition of “Cum on Feel the Noize.” Interested in rap-rock fusion, in 1988, he was backed by Metal Church on a cover of Black Sabbath’s “Iron Man,” and he joined the Presidents of the United States of America in a project called Subset. In 2003 he released a new solo album, *Daddy’s Home*, which features “Big Johnson,” written in response to his greatest hit which was released 11 years earlier. FTP, name this rapper, best known for 1992’s “Baby Got Back.”

Answer: **Sir Mix-a-Lot**

6. Douglas and Graham Walker have written the official guide to this game, whose 1967 World Championship was decided by the Fistful of Dollars. The Denouement and Crescendo are reverses of one another, and are two series of three moves that are part of the “Great Eight” gambits. Other gambits include the Toolbox, Bureaucrat, and Avalanche, each of which consists of throwing one of the game’s namesakes three times in a row. For 10 points, name this game, whose throws are represented by a closed fist, an open palm, and a peace sign on its side.

Answer: **Rock, Paper, Scissors** (accept equivalents before “namesakes”; prompt afterwards)

7. WARNING: Year and team required. Joe Beckwith made pitched two innings in the postseason after appearing in 49 games and compiling a 1-5 record. The starting pitching featured Danny Jackson in his first full season as a starter, and a career year from Charlie Leibrandt, who went 17-9, and was anchored by Cy Young winner Bret Saberhagen, whose 0.50 ERA in the World Series led the Comeback Kings to a championship. For 10 points, name this team which defeated their instate rivals, the St. Louis Cardinals to capture their only World Series.

Answer: **1985 Kansas City Royals**

8. Roger Kerrison of the BBC notes that a track entitled "Daddy Didn't Buy Me A Pony, I Got An SUV" would seem appropriate on this album. Other lowlights include the mention of llamas and misuse of the title of the fourth track, "La La", and a screech in the middle of "Love Me for Me." People point to "Shadow" as being influenced by the artist's living in the shadow of her older sister. For 10 points, identify this album which features "Pieces of Me," the debut of Ashlee Simpson.

Answer: **Autobiography**

9. A holiday edition of her one-woman show is currently playing at the Duplex in New York City. She appeared as Aunt Rose, who loved giving hugs on an episode of *The Mary Tyler Moore Show*, while fans consider her guest appearance on *Battlestar Galactica* as Siress Belloby a miserable failure. More prominent roles include Gertrude Lade on *The New Perry Mason* and Oscar's ex-wife Blanche on *The Odd Couple*, ironic since she was married to Jack Klugman in real life. For 10 points, name this actress, best-known for occupying the top-center seat on *Match Game*.

Answer: **Brett Sommers**

(NOTE: The person who answers this tossup correctly has just won a trip to a motel in lovely Encino, which they can take themselves.)

10. Wins over NYU and Manhattan earned it a berth into the NIT, and an 89-50 win over Kentucky in the quarterfinals was the worst loss of Adolph Rupp's career. Norm Mager's last-second layup clinched the title over Bradley, and they would win the rematch 10 days later, which for 10 points, gave what Nat Holman-coached school the only NIT-NCAA double in the history of college basketball, in 1950?

Answer: **City College of New York**

11. DKT claims that recently, only *Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix* is beating this product in speed and volume of sale in Indonesia. New Mexico's Department of Education supports Tony Escudero, who has been encouraging students to try them, while an Illinois health program which has distributed nearly 360,000 of them is being condemned by senator Steve Rauschenberger. The Paradise Sampler, LifeStyles' Luscious, and Tastee are all brands of, for 10 points, what type of protection, which comes in durian, orange, chocolate, vanilla, and mint varieties among others?

Answer: **flavored condoms** (accept "durian-flavored condoms" until the end of the first sentence)

12. She notes that during sweeps weeks, being rescued by a dolphin is not interesting unless it has been abused by Michael Jackson. Born in Ecuador, she regrets not sleeping with Peter Jennings. As a result, she is sent to report on a pro-masturbation protest at the library of Trumaine College, begun by the same group that protested the cancellation of *Psycho Dad* in the middle of winter outside of her station, WHBZ. For 10 points, name this reporter on *Married with Children*, played by Teresa Parente.

Answer: **Miranda Veracruz de la Jolla Cardenal**

13. Like "The Long and Winding Road", Raul di Blasio has an instrumental version on *Alrededor del Mundo*, but Boyzone also covers this song on its self-titled album, and a 1998 single by Sinead O'Connor also includes it. The original group released it as a single in 1979 with "Lovelight" as its B-side, and as part of *Voulez-Vous*, and opens it by noting that the title character "is enchained by [her] own sorrow." For 10 points, "try once more, like you did before, sing a new song" is the advice given in the chorus to the title character of what ABBA hit?

Answer: **Chiquitita**

14. She played the ex-girlfriend of yacht captain Will Parker in 1992's *Wind*, and an Elaine Taylor, an attorney who becomes romantically involved with a murder suspect as the star of 1996's *Portraits of a Killer*. She made her movie debut in 1984's *Reckless*, and sang "I Surrender Dear" as Lovey Lou in *Bloodhounds of Broadway*, but is better remembered for her part in another teen flick and another retrospective. For 10 points, name this actress who played Jeanie Bueller in *Ferris Bueller's Day Off* as well as *Baby Houseman*.

Answer: **Jennifer Grey**

15. Founded in 1923 by the Hassenfield Brothers, it began by selling textiles, but soon moved on to pencil boxes and school supplies. Today based in Rhode Island, this company owns many subsidiaries, such as Wizards of the Coast, and owns many brands such as Nerf, Easy-Bake Oven, and Play Doh. Purchasing Milton Bradley in 1984, and Parker Brothers in 1991, this largest producer of board games in the world has games including Risk, Trivial Pursuit, and Monopoly. FTP name this American toy and game company, the second largest toy maker in the world, second only to Mattel.

Answer: **Hasbro**

16. His mother worked as a casting director for "MacGyver" and used him as an extra in several episodes. After a series of British Columbia tourism commercials, he got his big break as Charlie Conway in the *Mighty Ducks* movies. He played Blaine Tuttle in *Cruel Intentions* but is better known as the teenaged loner whose love-hate relationship with Joey Potter turns into true love. FTP, who played Pacey Witten on "Dawson's Creek"?

Answer: **Joshua Jackson**

17. Conceived in the ticket line of a London railway station, she has dark hair surrounding a pale, serious face. Her smile floods warmth and life into her face, and has a disconcerting effect on the man who was hurled into space the very day she discovered how to make the world better, also the day Earth was seemingly destroyed to make room for a bypass. FTP, name this love interest of Arthur Dent in *So Long And Thanks For All The Fish*.

Answer: **Fenchurch**

18. Dubcat and Long Beach Shortbus were bands formed by the splitting of the group Long Beach Dub Allstars, which itself was formed from this band's two remaining members. Coming to an unexpected end on May 25, 1996, when drummer Bud Gaugh found the lead singer dead from a heroine overdose in a San Francisco hotel room, their third album was self-titled. FTP, identify this band whose prophetic lyric "life's too short", from their song "What I Got", seemed to eerily coincide with the tragic fate of singer and guitarist Bradley Nowell.

More notable ads feature a little black book, a telephone, sunscreen, and a bottle opener. These objects have supposedly just been invented, for 10 points, like what product, which now comes in bottles and six-packs, and is considered "BRILLIANT!"?
