Tossups:

1. In an adaptation of an H.P. Lovecraft story, this actor insists, "it's just a color." In one comic book adaptation, this actor laments, "Feels like my skull's on fire." This actor played opposite Laura Dern in a David Lynch Film and asks, "Are those toenails dry yet honey? We got some dancing to do." A character played by this actor says, " Sometimes I let matches burn down to my fingertips just to feel something, anything," in his introduction. In a Coen Brothers film, this actor plays a small-time criminal who creatively acquires an infant. That film was *Raising Arizona*. In 2023, this actor will play the role of Dracula in *Renfield*. For 10 points, what actor played Johnny Blaze in *Ghost Rider*, Spider-man Noir in *Spider-man: Into the Spiderverse*, and The Janitor in *Willy's Wonderland*? **ANSWER: Nicholas Cage**, (Accept Nicholas Kim Coppola)
2. In one film, a character played by an actor from the series *Wandavision* undergoes this process after a terrifying scene involving a water bed. In a Scott Derrickson film, the legal repercussions of this process are drawn out in a courtroom drama with Tom Wilkonson as the defendant and Laura Linney as the lawyer. On the TV show *Supernatural*, Sam Winchester is able to perform this process in reverse by saying its usual verses backwards. A found footage film about a minister's last attempt at this process grossed over 30 times its budget at the box office. An iconic poster of a man in a hat carrying a bag and standing under a lamppost is associated with a film titled for a practitioner of this process. That film starred Linda Blair and is often referenced with the food "pea soup." For 10 points, name this process via which an evil spirit is expelled from a person or place. **ANSWER: Exorcism**
3. In *an American werewolf in London*, David wears a T-shirt from a school in this city, to remind the audience that he is in fact an American Werewolf. Certain scenes in the vampire film *The Addiction* were filmed at a school in this city as the protagonist is a graduate student in philosophy. In *John Wick: Chapter 2*, the titular character takes a train through this city with stops that are nowhere near its actual route. In a science fiction film, Tom Cruise runs through a location in this city that is completely empty, despite usually being a tourist hub. In a John Carpenter film, Snake Plissken must escape this city with the president of the United States. For 10 points, what city is the location of the third act battle in *The Avengers* and where the lawyer Matthew Murdock practices in Hell's Kitchen? **ANSWER: New York City**
4. In a two part animated feature, this character is voiced by Jensen Ackles, where his city is plagued by a killer who only kills on federal holidays. Jensen Ackles also voiced a different character in another animated feature where this character is voiced by Bruce Greenwood, and his adopted son is voiced by Neil Patrick Harris. In *another* another animated feature, this character is voiced by Keanu Reeves, who mentions that he always works alone, except for "that guy Morgan Freeman played." In one live action depiction, this character battles an army of mind controlled penguins. In that same film, this character's eye make-up miraculously disappears when he removes his cowl. A more recent depiction of this character has associated him with the song "Something in the way," by Nirvana. For ten points, name this rich kid with issues from such films as *The Long Halloween*, *Under the Red Hood*, *DC League of Super Pets*, and *Hush*. **ANSWER: Batman**
5. In the musical *Young Frankenstein*, Frau Blucher (cue the horses) sings about how the title character was this type of person. In a Dove Cameron Single, the lyrics state that she could be a "better" this type of person. In a 1963 song by The Angels, the claim is made that this type of person is "back, and you're gonna get in trouble." In one stand-up bit by Donald Glover, he suggests that if you have a crazy version of this type of person, you're going to die. In *Scream*, Billy Loomis is this type of person to the protagonist Sidney Prescott, a tradition that is continued in the *Scream* revival when the killer also masquerades as this type of person. In a confrontation between Thanos and Starlord, Thanos calls Starlord this type of person in relation to Gamora. For 10 points, what type of person is a gendered term for a partner in a relationship? **ANSWER: Boyfriends**

6. On the show *House MD*, Dr. House often eats lunch with patients in this condition. There is a theory about the film *Skinamarink* suggesting the little brother has this condition. When the X-men character Rogue has her first kiss with a boy, she accidentally inflicts him with this condition. When Morpheus of the *Endless* is captured in a crystal cage in the basement of Fawney Rig, some patients around the world begin to suffer from this condition, including Unity Kincaid, who remained in this condition for the duration of his imprisonment. This is the in-canon explanation for a real epidemic in the early 20th century, known as *Encephalitis Lethargica*. In *Suicide Squad*, Amanda Waller threatens to put Dr. June Moon in a medically induced version of this condition to leverage Colonel Rick Flag. In the Pilot episode of *The Walking Dead*, Rick Grimes comes out of this condition to find the world overrun by zombies. For 10 points, name this condition, a prolonged state of unconsciousness, usually as a result of severe injury. **ANSWER: In a Coma**
7. Multiple novels in the *Little House on the Prairie* series take place in this region. A Capital city in a state in this region is sometimes referred to as “the middle of the mitten.” In one dubious claim, this region gets its name because of “skyline chili” and “Your cincinnati Reds, that haven’t won a world series since 1990.” One state in this region has the nickname, “Hoosier State” while another state in this region has the nickname “The land of 10,000 lakes.” A River in this region is dyed green on a certain holiday. Despite the name of this region, it is actually mostly on the eastern side of the country in which it resides. For the points, what United States region includes Wisconsin, Ohio, Illinois, and Iowa, among other states? **ANSWER: The Midwest**
8. In *The Possession* starring Sam Neil, a mysterious Doppelganger of his wife offers to help his child while he is in this location. A poster for the James Gunn movie *Slither* shows multiple alien organisms surrounding a woman in this location. In one scene in *The Big Short*, Margot Robbie explains the titular shorting while in this location. In an iconic shot from *The Nightmare on Elm Street*, Freddy Kruger’s knife fingers emerge from this location. In *The Nightmare Before Christmas*, the trick-or-treaters travel via a walking version of this location, and some have suggested those children died in that location. In *The Curse of La Llorona*, the title spirit attacks one of the children in this location. For 10 points, name this location often associated with bubbles and rubber ducks. **ANSWER: (Taking A) Bath**
9. In *Captain America: Civil War*, Peter Parker mentions that he would love to do this activity, but doesn’t because he wouldn’t have before he got his powers. In *Christine*, the protagonist’s best friend is injured during this activity. In one CW show, a character is told “there’s more to life than just” this activity, to which he responds “not for me, not anymore.” In another CW show, one character says, “you haven’t known the triumphs and defeats, the epic highs and lows of” this activity. *Friday Night Lights* and *The Blind Side* are two films related to this activity. For ten points, what activity is played by characters like Archie Jones and can lead to scholarship opportunities? **ANSWER: High School Football**
10. This material can be used to exemplify an entropic spring, because as its polymer chains are straightened, it becomes energetically favorable to return to a state of greater randomness, causing the material to retract. This material can also be used to demonstrate creep and ductile fracture when it experiences a certain amount of tensile stress. The scientific name of this material is polysiloxane. This material was discovered by James Wright in 1943 and the manufacturing rights were transferred exclusively to Crayola in 1977. This material is often packaged as a small colorful pellet. For ten points, name this material that “Bounces, molds, stretches, snaps & more!” **ANSWER: Silly Putty**
11. *The Monument Mythos* analog horror web series depicts a conspiracy where the president chooses an individual to be trapped in a monument to this person as a kind of “anti-pardon.” In an alternate history novel, this person is revived after his death before eventually dying again after being ripped in half shortly following the assassination of JFK. In that same series, this person is depicted as a Vampire Hunter, and in the film adaptation of that novel, this person is played by Benjamin Walker. In *National Treasure 2: Book of Secrets*, the Gates family is implicated in the plot to assassinate this person. In *Night At the Museum 2: Battle of the Smithsonian*, this person gives Larry advice in the form of one of his notable quotables: “A house divided against itself cannot stand.” For 10 points, name this 16th president of the United States. **ANSWER: Abraham Lincoln**

12. This geologic feature was responsible for major disasters in 1906 and 1989. Some of the cities along this feature are San Bernardino and Daly City. The movement of this feature and other similar features are referred to as “strike slips.” Due to the movement of this geologic feature, Los Angeles is slowly inching toward San Francisco. This feature is approximately 800 miles long and forms the boundary of the Pacific and North American tectonic Plates. Dwayne Johnson starred in a film where a scientist played by Paul Giamatti predicts a massive disaster related to this geological feature. For ten points, name this tectonic fault line that shares its name with a region in California and the fifth entry in the Grand Theft Auto series. **ANSWER: San Andreas Fault**
13. This actor has a brief cameo in Mission Impossible II as Mission Commander Swanbeck, a role which is swapped out in later movies with “The Secretary.” This actor played one of the two title characters in a film where Jonathon Pryce played the other, those characters are also known as Cardinal Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger and Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, respectively. This actor played the title character in a film where Scarlett Johanson performs an iconic Shower Scene. This actor was, for some reason, in *Transformers: The Last Knight*, where his character reveals that Transformers have been living among mankind for centuries. This actor plays Dr. Robert Ford, the cofounder and park director of *Westworld*. This actor has received two academy awards, one for playing a cannibalistic psychiatrist, and one for playing an aging man refusing help from his daughter. For 10 points, name this welsh actor who played Odin in the *Thor* series. **ANSWER: Anthony Hopkins**
14. In the JJ Abrams directed *Star Trek (2009)*, James T. Kirk performs this action while “Sabotage” by the Beastie Boys plays in the background. In *Indiana Jones: Kingdom of the Crystal Skull* Marion performs this action, after which the characters must survive the meaning of the cryptic phrase “Three times, it drops” from Dr. Oxley, which turns out to be three massive waterfalls. In *Need for Speed*, characters played by Aaron Paul and Imogen Poots perform this action, and then argue about whose eyes are bluer while hanging upside down from a helicopter. Dom performs a similar action between multiple buildings in *Furious 7*, despite O’Conner’s desperate appeal that “Cars don’t fly.” For 10 points, name this action performed by Thelma and Louise at the end of *Thelma and Louise* while they hold hands. **ANSWER: Driving off a cliff**
15. It’s not sharks, but a hammerhead version of this animal is known for its cannibalistic tendencies. The classic action film *Tremors* is about an uprising of giant versions of this animal. A children’s book about how to eat fried versions of this animal in a wagger was adapted into a 2006 film with the same title. A bioluminescent beetle found in caves is often referred to as a “glow” version of this animal because it is commonly found in a larvae state. A “flat”, predatory version of this animal is of the Platyhelminthes (*pla - ta - hel - munthes*) phylum and is often found free living in water, while “round” and “Tape” varieties of this animal are common parasites. The “Earth” variety of this animal is frequently cut into pieces by sadistic children testing the theory that those distinct pieces can continue to live. For ten points, name this wriggly animal whose “gummy” variety is a popular snack. **ANSWER: Worms**
16. The opening of the Paramount+ show *Wolf Pack* involves one of these vehicles trapped on the highway during a wildfire. On the show *Teen Wolf*, one of these vehicles is filled with the victims of a resurrected version of *La Bete de Gevaudan*. Also on *Teen Wolf*, a box containing the name plate of Sheriff Stilinski is found in one of these vehicles held by Jared, the notorious nervous vomiter who caused another one of these vehicles to be evacuated. In the Lego Ninjago Movie, one of these vehicles must scrape along in a lopsided conformation after all of its passengers move to one side of this vehicle to avoid Lloyd the green ninja. In *Man of Steel*, a young Clark Kent rescues a sinking one of these vehicles. A Magical one of these vehicles can traverse many impossible locations like outer space and within the human body. For ten points, name these yellow-orange vehicles used in the transportation of K-12 students. **ANSWER: School Bus**
17. The cover of *Envy of Angels (Sin du Jour #1)* depicts a product made from these animals. In *Creed*, part of Adonis Creed’s Training with Rocky Balboa is running around attempting to capture one of these animals. The Muppet character Gonzo is in a romantic relationship with one of these animals named Camilla. Claymation versions of these animals in a film starring Mel Gibson are all depicted with scarves, necklaces, and other accessories, supposedly to hide the seam in the clay figure where their head was attached to their body. A signature product of these animals can come in blue and pink varieties, depending on their breed. According to legend, these animals can run around for hours or

even days after their heads have been cut off. For ten points, name these featured farm animals known for crossing the road. **ANSWER: Chickens**

18. In *Guzo: The Thing Forsaken by God, Part I*, the tentacle monster in the basement is able to attack people in the upper floors of the house by using these objects. In *Constantine (2005)*, John is able to capture a soldier demon using one of these objects. It's not a phone booth, but in *The Matrix* series, characters are able to exit the Matrix using these objects. In *Nightcrawler*, a rage scene performed by Jake Gyllenhaal results in an injury from one of these objects. In *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone*, Dumbledore claims that one of these objects shows him holding a pair of socks, because he never gets socks for Christmas. "Impossible" shots involving these objects are achieved using tricks like body doubles or "two-way" versions of these objects. For ten points, name these reflective objects found on vanities. **ANSWER: Mirrors**
19. In an episode of *Doctor Who*, this person is considered a true genius because he is immune to psychic paper. In the *Sandman* Netflix series, this person attracts the attention of The Sandman during one of his centennial meetings with Hob Gadling. In one film, this person holds auditions in which the chosen monologue of most of the contestants is a speech written by his friend and rival that begins "Was this the face that launched a thousand ships?" An episode of *Good Omens* attributes the success of one of this person's works to a miracle that is Crowley's "treat" to Aziraphale. The plot of *The Lion King* is often likened to a tragedy by this person, which is itself inspired by a Scandinavian legend about a prince of Denmark. For ten points, name this Elizabethan playwright. **ANSWER: William Shakespeare**
20. In the underrated Mike Flanagan film *Oculus*, a character attempts to eat this food, but it turns into glass in her mouth. In *The Curse of the Black Pearl*, Captain Barbossa wants to eat this food once the curse is lifted, but does not get a chance to until he returns in the sequel's end tag. While winning the unwinnable *Kobayashi Maru* Test, James Kirk eats this food, because according to the director, it made him look like an asshole. The horse Max from *Tangled* is won over by Flynn Rider with this food. In *Indiana Jones: Temple of Doom*, Jones lures Willie Scott out of her room by eating this food. When Pippin asks about Second Breakfast in *The Fellowship of the Ring*, Aragorn tosses him this food. For ten points, name this fruit that comes in red and green varieties. **ANSWER: Apples**
